The Mentorship Program was created to support radical law students and recent graduates, promote new leadership within the Guild and develop lasting bonds among our members. We link law students, legal workers or recent graduates who seek mentors with Guild attorneys and experienced legal workers; mentors offer guidance, support and inspiration for less experienced members.

The Mentorship Committee guides the project and is made up of Guild attorneys, law students and legal workers from the greater Bay Area. Some of us are on the chapter's Executive Board and others hold national leadership positions. We meet once a month and welcome anyone who wants to join the Committee.

The Guild is committed to furthering social justice in multiple dimensions of power and identity. If you would like us to consider your self-identity as we attempt to match your mentor/mentee, please indicate as such on the enrollment form and we will do our best to meet your needs.
